Fatigue likely was the worst item we dealt with only after the non-observant drivers.

Today we ride with many, many very unsafe drivers, particularly those in 4 wheel vehicles due to their distractions. However, the distracted person we need to be most aware of is the one inside your head, you, the rider.

As we all have requested greater and greater sources of communications and information those industries have fulfilled our demands. The world of electronics and information has stepped up with an overwhelming selection.

All the items referred to above have tried to make us multi-task, but, since we are always looking for more information to enhance our riding experience the distractions are readily available.

Each of us, as a rider, has a responsibility to ourselves and the other users of the public roadways to be always safe as well as responsible for our actions. Obviously, other distracted vehicle operators potentially pose a great danger to us. The co-rider can also be of great assistance in monitoring the roadway for hazards and erratic drivers.

But, do we really need all that input to distract our minds from the love of the ride we really want to be enjoying? Did you see that animal in the shrub or the ditch while you were checking your route map or that most recent ding on your cell?

Recently on a ride we were discussing whether to activate the radio. The discussion revealed that we seldom even turn the radio on. A blissful day for us usually includes conversation, radio silence and little if any CB radio communication. We have been known to shut that off as well.
