Luck of the Draw

I was sitting here trying to decide if I was a lucky rider or a good rider! I have been riding motorcycles for 52 years and have never had a accident while riding a motorcycle. (knock on wood) Now I did total a motorcycle once by hitting a pot hole, but even then I still rode the bike home, it did not go down. So what I was trying to decide is, am I lucky or was there some skill involved there?

I personally have hit 4 deer without causing any damage to my bike. Now is that luck or is that skill. I would like to think that there is some skill involved in that statistic. I have come close to hitting many, many more deer and other critters as well. Now was that luck or was that skill?

While riding we have close call all the time. And you have to ask yourself, were you lucky or were you well trained. Were you scanning the road, and prepared to take the measures necessary to stay out of harm's way? If you were then that was not luck that saved you, that was skill.

Now, I cannot deny that there were times when I was just lucky, not to have been involved in an accident. But I can honestly say that there were many more times that I avoided hitting something or just being able to go around a corner because of the training I have received from Rider Ed courses.

The point I am trying to make is, Don't depend on luck to keep you safe out there. Take all the Rider Ed courses you can and keep your skill level up to the highest point you can, so the next time you have a close call you will not have to depend on luck to keep you safe. You will know it was your skill level that helped you avoid that accident.




